File Your FAFSA or VASA

All admitted students are encouraged to submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) if you have not done so already. If you are a Virginia resident and unable to complete the FAFSA or have Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status, the Virginia Alternative State Aid application (VASA) is an option available to you to apply for state financial aid.

Use VCU's school code, 003735, when completing your application. While VCU's FAFSA and VASA priority filing deadline was March 1, we encourage you to apply, as you may still be eligible for some types of assistance.
